You did well to duck the opening Spade lad and win the Second Spade. Assuming Hearts split 32 you have eight top tricks.

You successfully finessed Clubs for the ninth well played!

You opened 1NT. Harry bid a 2D transfer, after which you bid 2H. He then bid 3D.
Even if you suspect Harry has forgotten about transfers, you should always assume your partner has remembered the system. You may get a bad result on the board, but much more likely he'll remember next time. Also, you'll feel much worse if he actually has remembered (and has a good hand with Hearts and Diamonds), and you have assumed he's forgotten!
