- 2. **Minutes**: The minutes of the 34th AGM were read, approved and signed.
- 3. Matters arising: The President noted that in fact the C Team were demoted to Division 5
- 4. **President's report**: Mrs Robson submitted her report to the meeting, and it was adopted. (Copy on file).
- 5. **Treasurer's report**: Mrs Mole submitted the audited accounts to the meeting. The surplus for the year was £527, of which £166 was the profit made on the Congress. £100 of the Congress profit had been donated to Morven Stone's disabled friend for a trip on an ocean going yacht, and the remaining £66 to the Mayoress's charity, which was for the Air Ambulance Service. There is £5,313 in the reserve account and £1900 in the current account. The accounts were adopted. (Copy on file) Mrs Mole recommended that table money remain unchanged, and that the subscription be £2 per member plus the SBU levy (as yet unknown)
- 6. **Competition Secretary's report:** Mr Drysdale recommended that there be no change in the competition format for next year. He proposed that a Duplimate dealing machine be purchased by the club.
- 7. **Team Captains' reports;** These were given by R Drysdale (A Team) and M Patterson (Berwick Bears, formerly the C team) The A Team finished bottom of Division 1, and would consequently be playing in Division 2 next season. The Bears had won Division 5, and would therefore be promoted.

- 2. Print outs of the hands would be available
- 3. Boards for Simultaneous Pairs events could be dealt automatically.
- 4. Suitable hands for teaching could be dealt easily

There was a lengthy discussion. A counter suggestion was made that Bridgemate computers for instant scoring should be purchased instead. It was finally agreed that every club member should be consulted. A special meeting would be held in October, when a final decision would be reached.
