Peter's Lesson




Hello Tuesday and Wednesday folks!

Lesson: What is the *Rule of 7* or *Hold Up* when playing in no trump?

Rule of 7

When the defender leads:

- Add the number of cards you hold in in both the declarer and dummy hands.
- Subtract that total from the number 7.
- Duck the trick that many times.



A **hold up play** is designed to exhaust a dangerous opponent from cashing tricks. In the example above, **N/S** hold 5 cards in diamonds. **S** should hold up twice and win the third diamond trick to make 3 NT.

Now if **E** regains the lead with the ace of clubs, **E** will not have another diamond to play to retain control. However, if **W** has the ace of clubs, nothing could be done to prevent the defenders from wining more diamond tricks.


