Congratulations to Sue Jordan!

Congratulations to Sue Jordan for placing 437th of <u>all</u> ACBL members in the Barry Crane Top 500 for 2021. Sue also won the Unit 249 Mini-McKenney competition in the 500-1000 MP category. Sue earned an astonishing 354.58 MP during 2021. A close second and third were Jim Jordan at 336.10 MP and Rick Jordan at 304.45 MP.

Sue also won the 2021 Unit 249 Ace of Club competition in the 500-1000 MP category with 351.81. Final standings for the 2021 District 2 and Unit 249 Mini-McKenney and Helen Shanbrom Ace of Club competitions can be found on our Member Info page.

What is the Mini-McKenney Competition?

The Mini–McKenney Masterpoint Races recognize the ACBL members who earn the most masterpoints (MPs) in sanctioned tournaments and clubs (excluding NAP/GNT qualifiers and STaCs) within a calendar year. There are 15 race categories ranging from 0-5 masterpoints to 10,000+. A player is placed in a category based on his/her MP totals at the beginning of a given year. This race is named after William E. McKenney. His originality, drive and organizational ability did much to establish the ACBL. McKenney was the ACBL's first executive secretary and remained at the helm until 1947.

What is the Helen Shanbrom Ace of Clubs Competition?

The Helen Shanbrom Ace of Clubs winners are honored with a certificate for the most wins in club games during the previous year and within their respective point count category. Black points are counted and not points earned in STaCs and other special games paying pigmented points. This award is named after Helen Shanbrom, the most successful club player in ACBL history. Helen died in 2013 at the age of 90. Among her many contributions, Helen was a respected volunteer, philanthropist and highway safety advocate.

Be Mindful of Potential Scams

Note that **ACBL** has no **1-800** numbers. There is a 1-888 number if you are calling from Canada, but in all other circumstances, you will need to use a 1-662 number.

Canadian members should call: 888-219-9901

Sadly, there are scammers out there who may answer any old 1-800 numbers the ACBL previously had and ask for bank information. Please be careful and only use the official numbers.

Additionally, please be careful about email scams. No one from the ACBL will ever ask for gift cards or banking information in an email. This includes district/unit officers. You can read more about what to look out for the ACBL website.

ACBL Update to Covid Protocols for Tournaments

Due to the <u>CDC's updated recommendations</u> released on Friday, February 25, the ACBL's Covid protocols for tournaments have changed. These standards apply to all tournaments – sectionals, regionals and NABCs.

If the COVID-19 Community Level as determined by the CDC (<u>click here to search by county</u>) is "high," face masks will be required. **Masks will be optional** (though they are always recommended) for tournaments held in counties notated as having a "**low**" or "**medium**" Community Level as indicated by the CDC.

The Covid vaccination requirement is still in place.

Whether at the NABC or at a sectional or regional, attendees should be prepared by bringing masks to the tournament playing areas in the event the Community Level rate changes to "High." Masks are still recommended for attendees who are at high risk for severe illness or otherwise are a member of a vulnerable population. We also ask attendees to be courteous and wear a mask if seated at table with a high-risk player who asks for tablemates to wear masks.





Hello everyone. I am looking forward to seeing you at the club, beginning Tuesday, March 22nd.

Here is a lesson.

Let the Bidding Inform Your Lead.



Bidding

- •N bids 1 D Having 2 touching suits of equal length, bid the higher-ranking suit first.
- •S responds 1 S the 5-card suit
- •N rebids 2 C promising 5 diamonds and at least 4 clubs, keeping the bidding low.
- •S bids 2 D showing a preference for diamonds over clubs and a weak hand
- •The partnership appears to have found an 8-card fit.

Selecting the Lead

East is on lead. The bidding indicates that the opener has at least 9 cards in the two minor suits. The opener also did not support responder's spades and did not bid 1 no trump. Therefore, East suspects North wants to use dummy's trumps to ruff. When that seems to be the case, a lead of trump should be considered.

East leads the 5 of diamonds to minimize ruffing abilities.
