Here are six interesting hands played on BBO this past week which will be instructive for beginner and intermediate players. The first hand is from Impala on 7<sup>th</sup> September. After you have ruffed the third diamond high and drawn trumps, do you play spades or clubs?

What should North lead against 6S? Those that led AH got tops, while those who lead 10C, in the vain hope of getting a ruff, got bottoms when declarer discarded all her hearts on dummy's clubs and diamonds scoring an overtrick.
