A significant driver of this growth is a robust pipeline of new players. This month 26 students completed the Bridge Basics 1 course with many ready to sign up for Bridge Basics 2 in January. Thank you to Jane King and Barb O'Brien for igniting a love of the game among their students.

Our early-stage players often practice and play on Tuesday and/or Saturday. New players are encouraged to join the 0-50 game on Saturday. Adele Woolfe and Peter Tuttle and their team of dedicated volunteers create a welcoming environment that fosters learning among similarly skilled pairs. It gets really exciting when players advance to the 0-500 games, where table counts are rapidly rising.

The board is looking at adding more games - both face-to-face and virtual. We will be undertaking a survey of our membership to ensure we meet the needs of our early-stage, intermediate, and advanced players.

The next social will include a practice and play section, in addition to the open game. We hope participation reaches new heights.

Membership is still behind last year. If you haven't done so already, I hope you will support the London Bridge Centre, and benefit from discounted game tickets (only available to members).

A priority for the board is to foster a welcoming, respectful, friendly, and caring community at the London Bridge Centre. Fire Procedures for Members

If you discover a fire - Yell FIRE, then call 911 after exiting the building.

Take directions from the director or teacher.

Remain CALM. IMMEDIATELY proceed to the nearest exit. Close the door when everyone has exited.

Three exits are located as follows:

- a) in the far east corner by the library. Open by turning the latch on the door.
- b) in the middle east alcove by the accessible washroom. Open by turning the latch on the door.
- c) the main entrance.

Ensure members requiring assistance are helped to the closest exit door. There is a wheelchair at the back of the room, located by the AED.

IMPORTANT INFO

Never fight a fire with the fire extinguisher unless the fire is small and you think the extinguisher will put the fire out. It is located on the column near the name tags.

The extinguisher is located on the column near the name tags.

HERE IS HOW TO USE THE EXTINGUISHER

Pull the pin

Aim the hose at the base of the fire

Squeeze the lever

Sweep the hose from side to side



VOLUNTEER PROFILE – KAREN WILSON - DIRECTOR

Where were you born? I was born in Ottawa, Ontario.

Where did you go to school? My father's job took us to a number of locations in Atlantic Canada and Ontario. My early education was in Whitby, Ontario; and Halifax, Dartmouth and Port Hawkesbury, Nova Scotia. I finished elementary and high school in London, took courses at Western and I'm a graduate of Fanshawe College.



What was your first job? My first job was working after school as a cashier at the A&P store near our home. In those days, the cash registers didn't tell you how much change to give back and we happily took cheques as payment ... a lot has changed.

What job did you hold the longest in your working career? My longest-held position, and the one I found most rewarding, was as a capital campaign fundraiser for the London Health Sciences Centre working to raise \$120 million for the new buildings at the Commissioners Road site. I was fortunate to be recruited by the late Martha Curgin, an inspirational leader and mentor (and bridge player!), who provided me the opportunity to grow and learn in my career and as a person under her inspiring leadership.

In How Many Cities Have You Lived? As I said, my father's job took us to a few places, consequently I lived in eight cities in the first eleven years of my life. Since then, my life has been more rooted and I've only lived in two cities.

What was your best vacation? In the last twenty years, I've been fortunate to do a lot of travelling. The most memorable for me was my first trip across the Atlantic, a two-week vacation to France with my husband, Dwight, in 2004. We were getting to know each other and for me, it was magical.

How old were you when you first started playing bridge? That's an easy question to answer because it was only just over a year ago...and I was 67.

How did you find LBC? I think LBC found me! It was 2014 and my husband, Dwight, was discussing ways to facilitate the growth of bridge in London with Al and Sue Edwards. Subsequently, a few other bridge players joined them and work began to launch LBC. I offered to help with administrative tasks and served a year on the first board of directors as the club got underway.

What motivated you to become a board member? London Bridge Centre is such a tremendous organization and has done so much for the bridge community. I started taking lessons in the fall of 2023 and I was overwhelmed by the welcoming and supportive members. Now that I am enjoying the game, I really wanted to become more involved. When the opportunity arose to serve the membership, I was very pleased to take on the role.

What is your favourite part of being a board member? Although it's early in my tenure, I have enjoyed seeing the collaboration and cooperation of everyone involved at the board. Each director has an area of expertise or responsibility, but everyone works together to ensure the club's success.

What do you like best about LBC? Hands down (no pun intended!), it is the people. Everyone is friendly and welcoming. I have met so many terrific people, many of whom I count as good friends.

Tell us about your hobbies. I enjoy knitting, sewing, and reading as well as hiking and traveling.

What would people be surprised to know about you? I designed and made a wedding dress for a very good friend's daughter and the bride actually wore it for her wedding!








Leading Against No Trump Contracts

Whether defending or declaring scoring tricks in No Trump is a race to find the longest suit between your hand and your partner's. If your partner has not bid indicating a possible lead, the following options are likely.

A sequence **is at least three in a row**. This lead provides partner the best insight to your hand's holding.

At the bridge table, however, the choice of fourth best occurs more often than top of a sequence.

Here are some examples, with the lead in red.

AQ765

JT642

LEADING AGAINST A NOTRUMP CONTRACT

PARTNER'S SUIT:

- Lead the top of a doubleton (♠Q-6, ♥8-2).
- Lead the top of touching honors (♠Q-J-3, ♣K-J-10).
- With no sequence, lead low
 (♠Q-6-3, ♥9-5-2, ♠A-8-5-4).

LONG SUIT:

- Lead top of touching honors from a sequence:
 - A solid sequence (♣K-Q-J-7-3, ♠10-9-8-3)
- Otherwise, lead fourth highest (♥K-J-9-5-2, ♦A-10-5-3).
